CHANGING MORE LIVES

2022 was a year of large-scale rescues, challenging medical cases, miraculous recoveries, and partnerships with local authorities to help hold abusers accountable. Your support made all of this possible. Here are just a few of the notable rescues of 2022.

BEFORE







CUPID. CASPER AND CLOUD

Cupid, Casper and Cloud arrived suffering from severe burns and in need of emergency care. Our veterinarians placed them under anesthesia to evaluate their injuries and began managing their pain and helping them heal. Sadly, Cloud, the most severely burned cat, passed away days later. Cupid and Casper made a miraculous recovery and after two months of healing found a home together.





LEE COUNTY RESCUE

Our Mobile Response Team assisted authorities in removing 300+ animals from horrendous conditions at an unlicensed breeder. Dogs and small animals were crammed in filthy cages, and barn animals were packed in disgusting enclosures with no food or water. Many had medical concerns that required weeks of recovery before they could be adopted. The breeders pleaded guilty to animal neglect charges.





KAL

Kal was discovered severely emaciated in a kennel with no food or water in a Des Moines apartment where people were living. When he arrived, he weighed just 44 pounds and likely wouldn't have survived much longer. Over several weeks, Kal gained 30+ pounds, as well as regained his cuddly, bubbly personality. He was adopted by a wonderful family with children. His previous owner pleaded guilty to animal neglect.





JONESY

Jonesy arrived in extremely critical condition fighting for his life. We were told he likely had ingested rodent poison, but he also had other injuries and was unable to eat on his own. We began treatment immediately and placed a feeding tube, where he was fed a special recovery diet four times a day. After weeks of uncertainty, he began improving. He eventually made a full recovery and is now in a loving home.






MULTI-CAT RESCUES

ARL Animal Services and our Mobile Rescue Team assisted authorities with multiple cases of cats living in overcrowded conditions in Des Moines and throughout lowa. The rescues included three in the span of three weeks this fall, where a total of 100+ cats were rescued. In all of the cases the cats were ill, and some were very thin. Some were also very fearful and needed behavioral help. The vast majority have found homes while others are continuing to recover in our care.

SUPPORTING PETS & PEOPLE



The ARL's lifesaving mission extends beyond the four walls of our shelter and into our community. In 2022, with rising inflation and increased pet food and supply costs, plus continued economic stress from the pandemic, we found more people than ever struggling to feed their pets. We dramatically expanded our community pet food assistance programs to help meet that need, and we served pet parents in record numbers to help keep human-pet families together.



Reasons for Euthanasia


The ARL looks at every animal as an individual and not a number and determines a treatment or rehabilitation plan. We only euthanize animals that are dangerous or suffering, and only after we have exhausted all other humane and responsible options. We do not euthanize for space and there are no time limits on the animals in our care.


